1. Go to <u>https://education.skype.com/</u> and sign in with your Skype account. If this is the first time you use Skype in the classroom, you will be asked to create your profile for registration. Your screen name, email and location are required in the registration page.

2. When you have created your profile, you can go ahead to find and register for a lesson. Type the keyword of what you interest and click to search. The web page will show many related lessons or teachers online. Find the one you want to have and click on it to access. You will see the introduction to the lesson. Register for this lesson to participate in it.

3. You will be asked to choose a time slot to participate in the project. It is recommended to contact the project holder and get prepared for the online lessons.
